Integrated Care Fund – Ideas and Innovation Scheme

To support the integration of Health and Social Care an Integrated Care Fund was announced by the Scottish Government. £2.9 million has been allocated to North Ayrshire to support the delivery of improved outcomes from health and social care integration, help drive the shift towards prevention and further strengthen the approach of tackling inequalities.

The North Ayrshire Strategic Planning Group are looking for innovative ideas that will enable the partnership to meet the **needs and priorities** outlined in our **Strategic Plan** and focus on **prevention, early intervention and care and support for adults with complex and multiple conditions** in line with the requirements of the **Integrated Care Fund**. The fund is only available for 1 year therefore chosen projects will receive funding for 12 months.

All ideas should be submitted on the Integrated Care Fund – Ideas and Innovation Scheme template. Please note, the submission of an idea is about encouraging the generation of innovative ideas and is not linked to any bidding, tender or procurement process.
